Linda and her husband Robert were participants in numerous field trips throughout Iowa and would be seen off to the side, with their elaborate photo equipment, getting set up for the perfect shot. She was a delight to know, and her dedication to all of their interests was beyond remarkable. In 2015 for four months they visited the Althea R. Sherman Chimney Swifts' Tower during the nesting period. They provided many programs using those photos and were featured In Iowa Outdoors. With her husband, she has had an impact on so many. Linda will be greatly missed by so many who love the birds and plants and all of nature in lowa.

She and Robert are best known for their beautiful close-up photographs published in 2009 in Deep Nature: Photographs from Iowa. The photos were accompanied by an essay by ecologist John Pearson, and celebrated the beauty of nature in our remnant prairies, woodlands, and wetlands. Photos from the book will be on exhibit at the Cedar Rapids Museum of Art beginning in January.
